

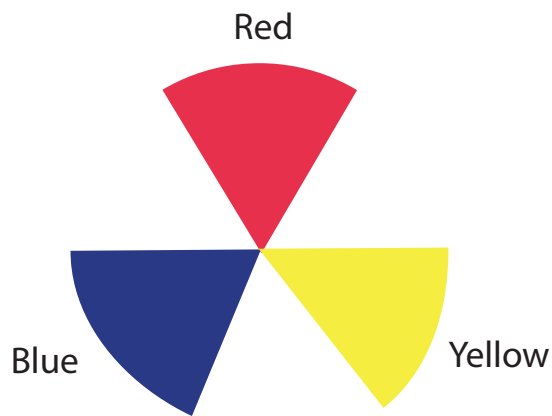
Color

It is important for an artist to know how colors work.

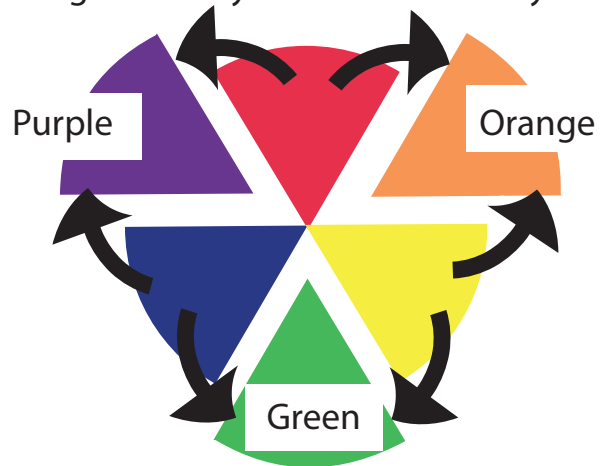
The first step is learning the color wheel.

It is a visual example of how colors mix and relate to each other.

It starts with the three primary colors.



When two primary colors are mixed together they create a secondary color.



Each of the six colors blends into the next to create a gradation of color.



With Blendy Pens you can create blends from color to color.

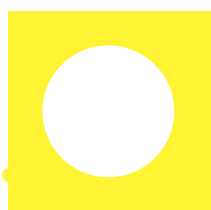


You can fuse your pen with two different colors and create a three color blend!

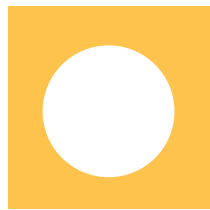


Your Blendy Pens Color Palette

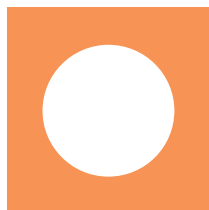
A palette is the range of colors that an artist uses. Get to know the color palette of your Blendy Pens by coloring in the circles to match the color.



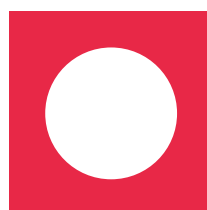
